HSBC Welcomes Evangelist Phil Shuler

Spring began with a huge spiritual “boost” as HSBC welcomed evangelist Dr. Phil Shuler to the platform for our annual Spiritual Renewal Meetings. Dr. Shuler and his wife Marie ministered to the Hamilton Square family from March 2-9, 2003. Dr. Shuler’s colorful true-life illustrations made each principle he expounded come alive. His personal testimony gave the Friday evening service an unusually powerful quality. Dr. Shuler related that as a boy he was unable to speak due to an almost fatal accident. Then, as a teen he was called by God to preach and subsequently miraculously healed.

At the invitation, men and women spontaneously filled both the altar and counseling rooms burdened to have God’s way with their lives. The evangelist later professed surprise to the overwhelming response to his testimonial message. In the past, this message has had a great impact upon young people dealing with God’s will for their future. On this occasion, however, the Holy Spirit used it to work in the hearts of many adults in a way he has never

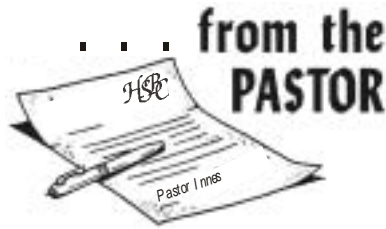

outgoing and fun-loving person. To all who knew him, he was a man of unselfish qualities who always seemed to form bonds with others. He was also well known in his community for his generosity and sumptuous cooking and baking.

Within the past two years, God's mercies led him into a new life. This carried him through his failing health with courage and strength. His encouragement to others was always "Trust God. God is good!"

Mr. Joseph went home to be with the Lord on December 14th, 2002 at the age of 82. Fenrick is survived by his eight children, 13 grandchildren and four great-grandchildren. His memorial service was held at Hamilton Square Baptist Church on Monday, December 16th.

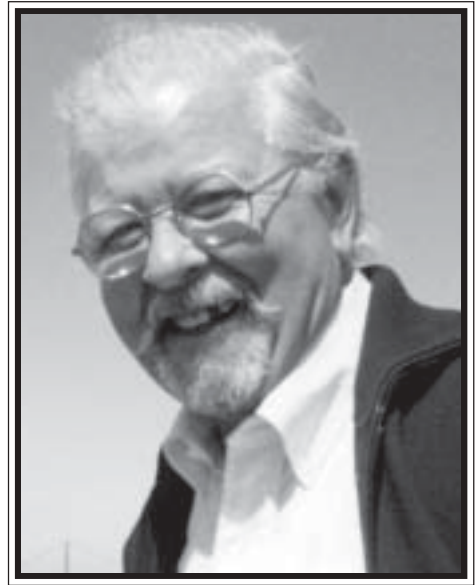

In Loving Memory
Henry Otto Normand
1938-2003



Henry Otto Normand was born in Berlin, Germany on February 13, 1923. In 1938 his family moved to Seattle, Washington where Henry learned English and graduated from High School. At 20, Henry enlisted in the Army where he served as a medical technician. While serving in the Western Pacific during World War II, he received several significant commendations for his exemplary service. He became a carbine sharpshooter and was sent back to the States in 1946.

After graduating from Seattle University Henry then went on to make millions for his employer and became dissatisfied. He then decided to go into business for himself which failed due to an unfortunate alliance with an unmotivated business partner. He then took another position where he again made millions for his employers. Upon his termination from this company, he became very depressed and began to seek the Lord.

Henry's sister Musa sent her pastor to Henry's home to give him the Gospel. Henry immediately received the Lord as his Savior. He bought a Bible right away and, thanks to his unemployment, was able to immerse himself in it day and night. He then recognized that indeed all things do work together for good (Romans 8:28) as he became thankful that he had lost his job. In the years that followed, Henry served the Lord in such ministries as Teen Challenge and the San Bruno Jail.

Henry married his dear wife Lydia on September 13, 1986. Together, they have served the Lord faithfully in the AIDS Ward at San Francisco General, many convalescent homes, jails, street ministry, the San Francisco Rescue Mission and the House of Salvation, their house church. At the time of his last Bible study before his death, Lydia asked Henry if he wanted to cancel due to

his illness. He said, "Do not cancel the Bible study, it might be my last!"

Henry and Lydia officially joined the Hamilton Square Baptist Church family in 1999 where He attended regularly until his health would not allow him to do so. Brother Henry went home to be with the Lord on February 12, 2003 just one day before his 80th birthday. Pastor David Innes presided over His memorial service at HSBC on February 19th where the congregation glorified the Lord through a great time of praise and testimony.

He recalled days of lying atop the stairwell with his brothers and sisters listening clandestinely to his father, Reverend Bob Shuler, host some the last century's most influential Christian leaders in their living room. often scolded for not being in bed as told, Dr. Shuler had the opportunity to hear the life experiences of many of God's men whose ministries still impact the religious world even today.

Mrs. Marie Shuler, though suffering from some ailments in her fingers, played the piano marvelously in each service. Mrs. Shuler, who once was Dr. Bob Jones Senior's personal pianist, inspired the congregation each night with

Christ-honoring hymns and gospel songs. During one service, she took suggestions from the audience for four favorite hymns and spontaneously composed a beautiful musical arrangement using them all.

May the Lord be praised for these wonderful eight days of meetings. While their time in San Francisco ended too soon, the work done by the Holy Spirit in the hearts of those attending will last for eternity. ■

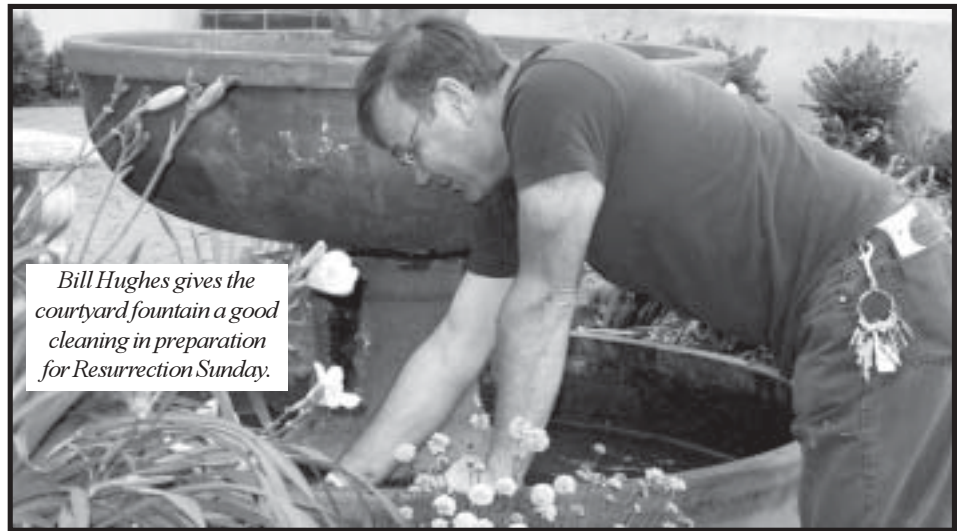
Happy Homebuilder's Couples Ministry

SHEPHERDING THE SHEEP

Fifteen brave men attended the Men's retreat in March at the Lucerne Conference Center. The messages at the retreat were superb and the food was outstanding. Pastor Kevin Schmidt and the staff at the conference center outdid themselves and our men were the benefactors of that ministry.

Pastor Ron Ehmann from Elko, Utah was our speaker. One of the messages in particular was very helpful and very thought provoking. As I was in my room the next morning having a personal time with the Lord, an application from one of the message was such a blessing to me and I pondered over the message. The application or thought I had deals with spiritual deception and the reality of Scripture.

God gives us in His Word all that we need to know about how to live a life that is pleasing to Him. But it also sets forth life and reality as God clearly sees it. God's Word

tells us in Genesis that He created man in His own image to love and serve Him. He, the Creator, has set the parameters in which we are to live and serve Him. Anything in life that deviates us from that course is caused by only one of two things – our flawed, sinful nature or a precisely crafted dart from Satan that is accurately launched into our hearts and minds to destroy us.

I think of so many times when I have had a wrong thought or purposely shared a harsh word with others. I blamed my pride and

old sin nature. But what if I am a Christian who has made a commitment to serve God wholeheartedly and to obey His word and His very clear principles in His word, yet still struggle with hateful thoughts or hateful actions?

As I was reading in Genesis, the

idea just became crystal clear to me that those types of thoughts and actions have to be a demonic dart sent by the evil one to destroy me. There is no other option for it. If we are "sold-out" to God and actively worship Him, love Him, serve Him each day from the depths of our heart, mind and soul as we should, the only one who wants to deviate us is the evil one. He wants to deviate us with lies about what is real, deceive us about what is real, and accuse us with guilt for failing to meet an unbiblical, perfectionist standard. God's Word teaches what is real and what is not. God's opinions, teachings, and perspectives are the only ones that matter. Anything that draws us away from the reality of Scripture and replaces our human reasoning and rationalization processes with God's is caused by a lying, deceitful, and accusative dart from the evil one.

How wonderfully freeing it is to know that mean, evil, wicked, hateful thoughts and feelings that flood our hearts and minds from out of nowhere are darts from the devil designed to deviate us from the reality of the Christian life. I think that I give my sin nature too much credit at times for the actual work of the evil one against me as a minister of the Gospel and a believing child of God. How wonderful it is to know that those darts can be immediately quenched by the shield of faith that immediately remembers, quotes aloud, and claims God's words and His promises. What a marvelous joy and peace results when we compare what we believe to be the reality of the situations that face us daily with the supreme reality of God's Word and stand upon its promises! ■
